Learning Project - to be done throughout the week: Celebrate Deaf Awareness Week

Research – Research famous deaf people. Create an information poster or leaflet about their work. Who was Thomas Edison? What is he famous for? Why was his achievement so remarkable? What challenges do you think his hearing impairment posed in his work? Write his biography.

Edison is famous for his quote, 'I have not failed; I have just found 10, 000 ways that didn't work.' How does this quote demonstrate a growth mindset?

Promote – Create a poster promoting Deaf Awareness Week. Write a set of instructions that we can display around school that explain how to communicate with someone who has difficulty hearing.

Communicate- Learn BSL – British Sign Language – and learn how to sign key words until you can say a sentence. Teach this to others. How many different sentences can you say?

Music – Have a go at making your own musical instrument using objects from around your home. What can you use to explore pitch and volume? Send in pictures or videos of your finished work. We would love to see them! Have a go at signing your favourite song and teach it to others.
