

Learning to be independent is a life skill. It requires the skills and attributes of a citizen in our community and who upholds modern British Values, someone who is responsible for their own actions; respectful towards others; tolerant and patient; who accepts rules and who is thoughtful towards others. At KGPS we take this seriously and expect children who travel alone to demonstrate these attributes and uphold the good name of our school through all of their actions.

To this end, your child will be able to travel alone if we feel they meet our expectations. They should prepare answers to the following questions which they will be interviewed or tested on before we feel they are ready to travel without an adult to and from school.

1. What are our school rules? How do you demonstrate these when travelling to and from school alone?
2. To be a good citizen what are the British Values the school expects you to demonstrate when travelling to and from school alone?
3. In order to be ready you must know some contact numbers "off by heart" / in your head. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What is your phone number?• What is your parent/ carer's phone number?• What is the school phone number?
4. What is your full address? (This should be set out accurately – find out how to do this.)
5. What is the right thing to do if you see other children on their mobile phones on the school path?
6. What is the right thing to do when crossing any road?
7. What is the right thing to do if an unknown adult accuses you of bumping into them on the footpath?
8. What will you do if approached by a stranger?
9. What does it mean to represent our school in the local community? How do you show you are proud to be a pupil at Kingsbury Green Primary school?
