Grammar:

Children will:

- Link sentences using conjunctions for example (because, and, but etc).

Spelling:

French

Children will learn to:

- introduce and ask someone else's name.
- say how they feel and ask how someone feels.
- count from 1-12.
- discover countries where people speak French

Religious Education

Children will learn about what makes a building sacred, and learn about the different religious buildings, communities and symbols.

Children will explore and discuss the features and practises within sacred places.

Physical Education

Outdoor – Tennis, Basketball and Hockey

Children will:

- learn how to feed a ball accurately to their partner
- consolidate and develop the range and consistency of their skills in net games.

Indoor - Dance and Gymnastics

Children will:

- create and perform dances using a range of movement patterns
- identify what makes a performance effective and suggest improvements based on this information.

Science

Rocks

Children will:

- compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties.
- describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock.
- recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.
- investigate different soils in the local area

Maths

Number and place value:

Children will:

- make numbers using different representations.
- find 10 or 100 more or less than a number.
- recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones).
- compare, order and write numbers up to 1000.
- count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100

Addition and subtraction:

- add and subtract numbers mentally, including: a three-digit number and ones; a three-digit number and tens; a three digit number and hundreds.

Children will:
