Grammar

Children will learn:

- co-ordinating conjunctions (and, but, so and or)
- subordinating conjunctions (because, although, when)
- adverbials for time (e.g. later), place (e.g. between) and frequency (often)

Spelling:

- words with the silent b, words ending with the suffix ‘-ible’ and words ending with the suffix ‘-able’

Computing

Digital Literacy

Children will:

- learn how to access remote learning platforms such as Microsoft Teams effectively and safely
- learn how our online identity is similar to and different from our offline identity
- develop guidelines that can be used to promote an online reputation that is both appropriate and safe

Religious Education

Key question: Who is to blame if we do wrong?

Children will:

- explore the sacrament of Bar/Bat Mitzvah
- compare the difference between adult and infant baptism
- compare the similarities and differences in fasting across different religions
- explore the beliefs of different kingdoms

Physical Education

Outdoor (Football):

Children will:

- pass ball with accuracy while on the move, using correct technique and timing
- control the ball with either foot, judging pace of ball correctly

Indoor (Dance - Tudors):

Children will:

- create and perform dances using a range of movement patterns
- identify what makes a performance effective and suggest improvements based on this information.

Science

Earth and Space:

Children will:

- describe the movement of the Earth and other planets relative to the sun in the solar system
- describe the movement of the moon relative to the Earth
- describe the sun, Earth and moon as approximately spherical bodies
- use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky

Maths

Number: Place value

Children will:

- read and write numbers to one million
- count in tens, hundreds, thousands and ten thousands
- compare and order numbers to a million
- round numbers to a million to the nearest 10, 100, 1000
- convert English numerals to Roman numerals and Roman numerals to English numerals
- read negative numbers in context

Number: Addition and Subtraction

Children will:

- add whole numbers with more than 4 digits using the column method
- subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits using the column method
- round to estimate and approximate
- use inverse operations (addition and subtraction)
- solve word problems using addition and subtraction (single step and multi-step)

Wider Curriculum

History: Anglo Saxons

Children will be able to understand and explain:

- how the weakness of Roman empire aid the Anglo Saxon invasion, how were the Vikings successful in entering Britain and how Battle of Hastings was a result of King Edward's death,
- Anglo-Saxon invasions, settlements and kingdoms: place names and village life
- the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England
- Viking raids and invasion
- resistance by Alfred the Great and Athelstan, first king of England
