Dear Parent/Carer,

Kingsbury Green Primary School is diverse in many ways, and this brings us strength and opportunity. This year through our curriculum, we aim to initiate more discussion about our similarities and differences and the importance of understanding a range of experiences. In line with our vision and values, we want to build children's **empathy** and resilience by equipping them to recognise and tackle injustice and continue to care for one another.

Black History Month is traditionally celebrated during the month of October. We are aiming to have a focus on the contribution and achievements of Black people in the UK and around the world. We aim to teach about how our culture has been enriched and our society has been made stronger because of the people who arrived in the UK from other parts of the world at different times, as well as the achievements and contributions of their descendants and those born here in the UK. This however is just the beginning!

One of our school improvement priorities this year is to *"Ensure diversity across the curriculum to engage and motivate all learners and to develop a non-bias view of the world around them."* This is important to create a sense of identity and belonging and to achieve our goal of growing *"responsible global citizen"* as set out in our school vision statement.

We are doing an analysis of our curriculum with an aim to improving representation across the curriculum including re-examining how certain subjects are taught through a western or colonial lens, and re-framing this to include the identity of all our children within a broad and rich curriculum.

When I visit lessons and look out at our children playing together in the playground, I am always struck by how inclusive they are and how kind they are to one another. This is already a strength of our school!
