

English

Reading

Children will focus on their reading targets this half term to develop their skills.

They will learn to:

- listen to and talk about a range of stories and texts
- understand both the books they can already read themselves and those they listen to
- talk about books and poems, taking turns and listening to what others say

Writing

Children will write sentences by orally rehearsing their sentences and laying out a simple plan. They will practise proofreading, making simple additions, revisions and corrections to their own work.

Grammar

Children will learn to write sentences using the present and past tense.

Spelling

Children will continue to learn to spell the year 2 common exception words and will start using apostrophes in their spelling.

Physical Education

Outdoor

Children will:

- continue to explore and develop fundamental movement skills, becoming increasingly competent and confident with their own motor skills.
- they will explore from a range of bouncing and catching skills, field games, throwing, running and jumping, agility and target games including attacking and fielding.

Science

Animals including humans

Children will:

- notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults
- find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)
- describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene

Maths

Addition and Subtraction

Children will:

- subtract a 2-digit number from a 2-digit number (crossing 10)
- find and make number bonds to 10 (tens and ones)
- add three 1- digit numbers
