Reading

Children will

- learn skills like prediction; questioning; clarifying; summarising and inference to aid understanding of the text

Texts studied: Stig of the dump by Clive King

Human Family by Mary Angelou

Writing

Text: Fly Eagle Fly by Christopher Gregorowski

Application write: Presentation of interpretations of key themes of the story

Text: The Wild Girl by Christopher Wormwell

Application write: Narrative including a character and setting description

Grammar

Children will

- learn how to create a sentence with the correct subject verb agreement

Spelling

- Suffix – children will learn to add the suffix-ed and -ing to words

Art

Fossil Clay Tiles

Children will

- analyse research studies on fossils
- design a relief board using fossil patterns
- create a relief board using card, string, split peas roll out and cut clay
- understand the properties of clay
- use clay to add additional detail in relief to the surface

Science

Rocks

Children will

- compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties
- describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock
- recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter
- investigate different soils in the local area

Music

Body Percussion

Children will learn

- how to play and care for a Clarinet/Dood safely
- the features of instruments within the Woodwind family and how they can be played differently
- how to perform as part of an ensemble
- the importance of taking care of musical equipment
- how the development of technology impacts musical instruments

French

Children will learn

- greetings - introducing, asking someone else's name
- feelings - saying how you feel, asking how someone feels
- counting from 1-12
- research countries where people speak French

Children will

- learn how to be safe and kind online
- understand how to use search engines safely
- learn to access, complete and upload work on various learning platforms such as Microsoft Teams and Rockstar Maths

Being Me

Children will

- create a charter about rules and expectations
- recognise feelings of oneself
- learn about how to face challenges positively
- learn about the importance of making responsible choices
- use empathy to understand others

Maths

Number and place value

Children will

- make numbers using different representations
- find 10 or 100 more or less than a number
- recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones)
- compare, order and write numbers up to 1000
- count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100

Addition and subtraction

Children will

- add and subtract numbers mentally, including: a three-digit number and ones; a three-digit number and tens; a three-digit number and hundreds

Children will

- begin to understand history from the earliest times to the present day
- describe features of past societies and periods (Jurassic period)
- place the time studied on a timeline
- recognise that there are reasons why people in the past acted as they did

Children will

- modify actions independently using different pathways, directions and shapes
